Will I be able to work while in nursing school?

The decision to work is a personal one. Nursing course credit hours each semester range from 8-11 hours, but the number of contact hours per week for these courses range from 21-25 hours. Recommended time for studying and class and clinical preparation outside of class and clinical is 20-25 hours. With the total number of hours for class, clinical, preparation and studying equaling approximately 40 hours, the faculty do not recommend working full-time during the semester. For the LVN-RN Transition track, the classes are online, but students should still consider the same number hours described above for class and preparation as a guide when weighing the option to work. Faculty encourage students to consider time allotments carefully in order to be successful.
