QUALITY ENHANCEMENT PLAN UPDATE

In Fall 2019, Panola College initiated its Quality Enhancement Plan that seeks to improve student performance in two areas: student learning and student success.


The QEP measures three STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES (SLOs) and the goal for each measure is 70% success. The results for full-time students enrolled in Learning Framework in Fall 2022 are provided below. Consolidated data indicates that 215 of 321 students completed at least 70% of the SLOs correctly. However, SLO 1 shows a regression in student performance compared to previous years.

The QEP also measures five **STUDENT SUCCESS GOALS** (SSGs): how many students successfully finish the LF course, 15 hours, 30 hours, a degree or certificate, or transfer to another college. Here are the results for full-time, non-dual credit students enrolled in Learning Framework from 2019-2022 with a breakdown of the 2019 and 2020 cohorts.

Are Your Students Confident They Can Succeed?

The following questions are included in the post-course survey given in the last module of the LF course. How do PC student responses match up to responses given nationally on the Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE)?

Having a positive academic mindset is one factor that predicts academic success. PC students who have taken Learning Framework appear to be more confident in their academic abilities and ability to finish a degree as compared to previous years and students nationally.

Revisions to Learning Framework

The assignment for SLO 3 has been revised to assess multiple learning strategies used in note taking, reading comprehension, memorizing new material, preparing for tests, etc. Students are still required to complete the note taking exercise included in previous versions of Learning Framework. However, the SLO now also requires students to write a reflection on each learning strategy presented in the assignment. The SLO assignment was changed because students generally would skip over the note taking exercise which would adversely affect their overall grades and SLO performance data.

Welding students showed a significant regression in finishing the LF course and SLO completion in F22.

The dedicated course had 16 of 30 WELD students enrolled. Five of the 16 did not complete the course successfully and 14 of 16 did not complete the SLOs successfully. This group requires continuous monitoring and motivation to be successful. Dr. Morris will be the primary instructor for all WELD LF students beginning F23.
